State Proposition 33 is the biggest threat to California's housing industry – for both homeowners and renters. We need all realtors to help defeat Prop 33. If passed, it will reduce home values, prohibit charging market rate housing indefinitely, severely limit control over on your own property, allow for severe rent and evection controls, cause a loss of revenue for homeowners when operating costs continue to rise. ## C.A.R.'s Positions on State Ballot Measures





**Proposition 3** – Repeal of Proposition 8 (2008) – SUPPORT

It amends language to wipe discrimination from the California Constitution and protect the fundamental right to marry for same-sex and interracial couples.



Proposition 34 - Yes on Prop 34 will close an exploited loophole in our health care system that has diverted hundreds of millions of taxpayer dollars away from patient care AND drastically reduce Medi-Cal prescription drug costs.

Requires specified healthcare organizations to a higher percentage of their revenues on direct patient care – **SUPPORT** 

This Health Care Provider Spending Mandate requires certain health care providers (AIDS Healthcare Foundation – a slum landlord that funds detrimental housing propositions) to spend 98% of revenues from federal discount prescription drug program on direct patient care.

We're sounding the alarm because this measure asks Angelenos to adopt a new forever tax that lacks oversight and accountability guardrails. Beware! We backed Measure H in 2017 to provide 10 years of dedicated resources to take care of our unhoused neighbors. However, Los Angeles County's homelessness population grew 43% between 2018 and 2023. We call on our county's elected leaders to show improvement before demanding more taxpayer dollars. Business leaders support homelessness solutions that deliver humane results."

# Understanding Taxes BOND vs. PARCEL

#### **Bond Tax**

#### WHAT IS IT:

Based on the value of home/parcel - with varying interest rates and lengths of payment (like a mortgage). Most need 2/3 approval to pass. However, School Bonds need a 55% threshold.

#### HOW IS IT USED?

The borrowed money must be used to fund building/facility upgrades and improvement.

#### **Parcel Tax**

#### WHAT IS IT:

All property owners pay the same, flat amount regardless of property value or size. The measure must pass with a two-thirds supermajority of voters in favor.

#### HOW IS IT USED?

 Can fund general operating expenses (including salaries or programs) as well as facility upgrades and improvements.

Measure HB: Public Safety/City Services is a local sales tax of 3/4 cent. If voters approve the Measure, it is expected to generate approximately \$3 million each year in dedicated and locally controlled funds that benefit Hermosa Beach residents and businesses. The Measure has a sunset clause 20 years from the effective date, or until ended by voters. Click here for more information.

**Hermosa Beach School District's Measure HV** is a \$28.7 million general obligation bond program. The measure is intended to address the needs of the local student population through new construction, modernization, and renovation projects at the District's three schools. **Manhattan Beach Sales Tax Measure – MMB** is a sales tax. Currently, the sales tax rate in Manhattan Beach is lower than many nearby



communities. The Manhattan Beach City Council placed a measure on the November 2024 ballot, asking voters to increase the local sales tax rate by one-half cent. This measure would bring Manhattan Beach's sales tax rate in line with nearby communities and generate an estimated \$5.3 million in local funding for essential services. **Measure RLS -** Most Manhattan Beach schools were built over 70 years ago and need urgent repairs and upgrades to support quality education. Leaky roofs, deteriorating plumbing, restrooms, and gas and sewer lines need to be fixed or replaced. Classrooms and labs need updates to meet current educational standards for science, technology, engineering, math, reading, and writing instruction. However, the State does not provide dedicated funding for school facility improvements unless school districts have local matching funds. Click here for more information.
